This precept comes into effect on **16<sup>th</sup> September**, which marks the anniversary of Pope Benedict's visit to us.

**THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL – AN INTRODUCTION**

By 'the Missal' we mean the official liturgical book which contains the texts prayed by priest and people at every celebration of Mass. This is the large book that rests on the Altar while a priest celebrates Mass. It is properly called the Roman Missal (*Missale Romanum* in Latin). Until the early 1960's, the Mass was celebrated in Latin throughout the world. At the Second Vatican Council it was agreed that the Mass could be celebrated in our own language, and in 1970 Pope Paul VI agreed the official Latin text that would be used. This was then translated into different languages to be used throughout the world. It proved to be a huge task which was completed in a very short time. However, because it was done so quickly, some of the richness of the original Latin prayers was quite literally 'lost in translation'. It was seen that a further translation was needed. The new translation would keep the original words, meaning and style of the Latin as far as possible. The number of changes since previous editions is not large and the structure of the Mass we celebrate remains the same. The new edition of the Missal will include some additions, such as prayers for the Saints who have been added to the liturgical calendar by the Church, and some other texts and prayers.
