**THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL – Silence BEFORE and AFTER Mass within the main body of the church.**

All the great spiritual writers have insisted upon the need to cultivate silence and recollection. In the world in which we live with its distractions and noise, many feel the need for an oasis of silence and calm. Our churches can and should help to meet this need. In recent years the silence and recollection of Mass has been disturbed in some churches by unnecessary conversation both before and after the celebration of the sacred liturgy. Even St. John Chrysostom (347 – 407) had to remind the faithful of his time that 'the church is not a barber's shop or a chemist's or a market stall; it is the dwelling of angels; it is the kingdom of God; it is heaven itself.....in the church, only spiritual things may be spoken, for this is heaven'. The church is our Father's house and the place where the community experiences its fellowship in Christ and should be a place where all are made welcome. It is possible to do this and at the same time not neglect that prayerful preparation which leads to a more profound participation in the celebration. Even St. Paul had to remind some of the more exuberant members of the Corinthian community that the character of the house of God as a house of prayer must not be overlooked.
