### **FOSTAH HOMELESSNESS CONFERENCE**

#### **Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> January, 10.00am – 2.00pm**

St. Augustine's is once again hosting a 'mini conference' on the subject of 'Homelessness in St. Austell' organised by FOSTAH (Friends of St. Austell Homeless). Much has been achieved for the homeless in St. Austell since the first conference held in January 2008. STAK has moved to new premises and increased its opening hours. St. Petroc's Society has established three 'move on' flats for seven former homeless clients. Cornwall Council has appointed a 'Homelessness Strategy Manager', undertaken 'Rough Sleeper' surveys and has established a regular 'Cold Weather Provision' policy. Cosgarne Hall Ltd. took over the management of the buildings and accommodation of Cosgarne Hall and became a Registered Charity in September 2009. The St. Austell Food Bank has been established and 'Street Pastors' now operate in the town at weekends. There is a great deal of hope in all these provisions. However, there are still many homeless and needy people in St. Austell and the situation is getting worse as the economic crisis develops. Much is still needed to be done! All are welcome to the conference - there will be no charge and coffee/tea and a light lunch of homemade soup and a roll will be provided.
