STREET PASTORS

Many cities and towns, not only in the UK but also worldwide benefit greatly from the quiet ministry of Street Pastors. Their role is to care, listen and help, working with those who find themselves in difficulty on the streets during the late evening and early hours of the morning at weekends. In St Austell they go out in groups of four on alternate Saturday nights and special occasions, taking with them bottled water, flip-flops, emergency blankets and lollipops. They are all trained in first aid and administer it when necessary. The Street Pastors have built up a great deal of respect in the community and street crime has reduced in areas where they operate. If you would like to help but can't stay up until 3-4am, please consider becoming a friend - forms are available in the Narthex.
